## I'm looking for the basics. Where can I start?

The [Personal Finance Ecosystem](#) is a research-informed framework from the National Endowment for Financial Education that describes the factors influencing an individual's state of Financial Well-Being including literacy and education.

A good starting point is the [Money Smart](#) curriculum from the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). Agency staff can complete the training independently, but there are also curriculum packages, that contain everything needed to deliver the training to clients, including instructor guides, PowerPoint slides, and participant guides for curricula tailored for [young adults](#), [adults](#), and [older adults](#).
